



BUILDING A BETTER I-4

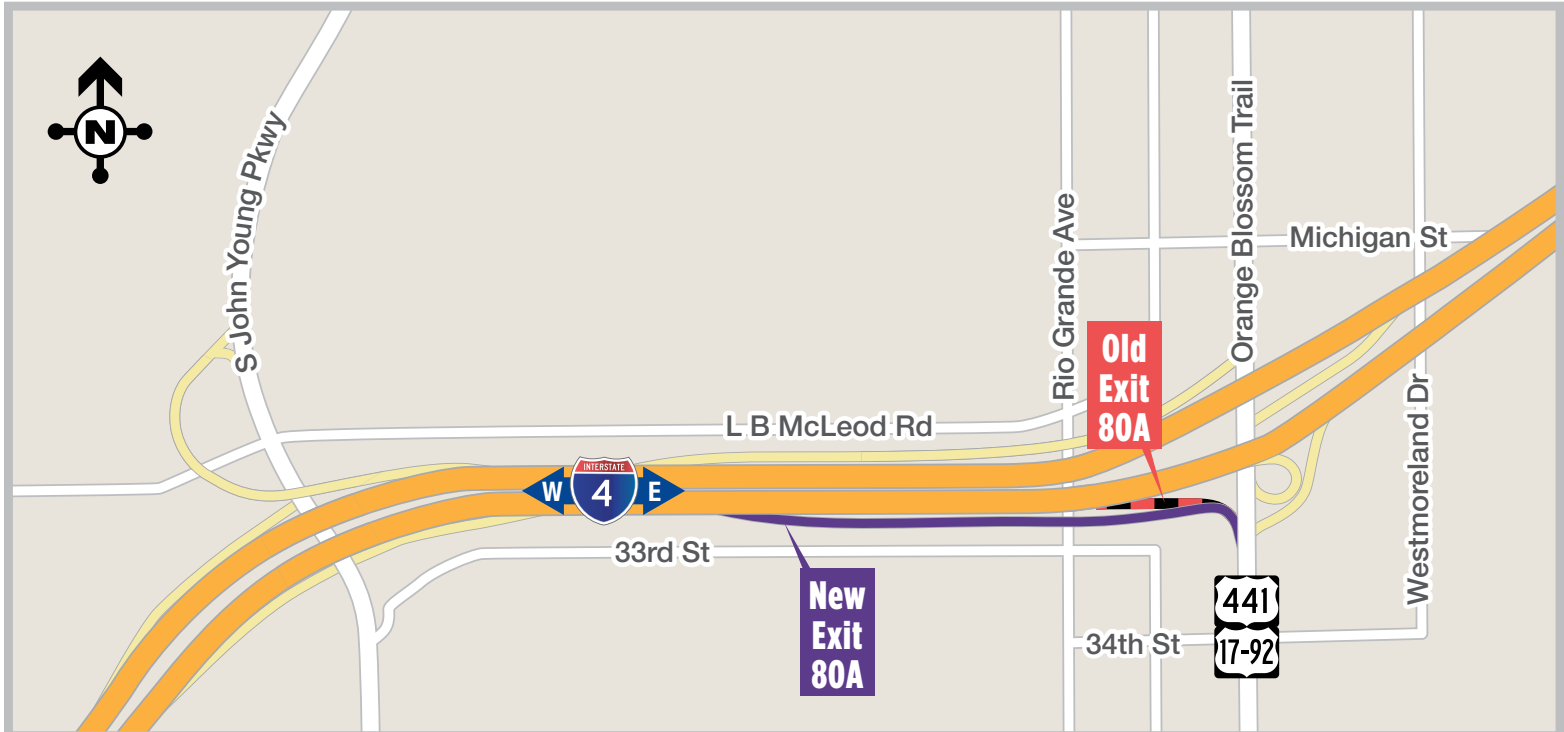
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EASTBOUND I-4 EXIT RAMP TO SOUTHBOUND ORANGE BLOSSOM TRAIL (EXIT 80A) SHIFTING TO TEMPORARY CONFIGURATION

THE EASTBOUND INTERSTATE 4 (I-4) EXIT RAMP TO SOUTHBOUND ORANGE BLOSSOM TRAIL (U.S. 441-17/92) IS SHIFTING NEARLY ONE HALF-MILE SOONER ON THE MORNING OF NOVEMBER 29

As soon as the morning of Thursday, November 29, motorists who use the eastbound I-4 exit to southbound Orange Blossom Trail (Exit 80A) will use a new configuration. The shift requires motorists to exit eastbound I-4 nearly one half-mile sooner. Motorists will travel on a new eastbound I-4 bridge over Rio Grande Avenue before reaching southbound Orange Blossom Trail. The ramp shift is necessary to create additional room for construction crews to complete work at the I-4 and Orange Blossom Trail interchange.

The \$2.3 billion I-4 Ultimate project is reconstructing 21 miles of interstate from west of Kirkman Road to east of State Road 434 in Longwood.
