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Major traffic shift planned for westbound I-4 in Orlando

ORLANDO — A major traffic shift is planned this weekend on westbound Interstate 4 (I-4) near Ivanhoe Boulevard. The long-term traffic pattern will relocate the westbound lanes to the west of the existing traffic lanes.

Due to the complexity of the operation, work will occur during the course of two nights. The traffic shift is expected to begin overnight on Saturday, September 26, and be complete overnight Sunday, September 27, weather permitting. The traffic shift is approximately a half mile long across Lake Ivanhoe.

All of the work is planned during overnight hours, and the new westbound lane configuration will be ready for morning drivers using westbound I-4 on Monday, September 28.

Motorists should be aware that modifications or extensions to this schedule may become necessary due to weather delays or other unforeseen conditions. Motorists are advised to maintain a safe speed when driving through the work zone.

The I-4 Ultimate project is rebuilding 21 miles of Interstate 4 (I-4) from west of Kirkman Road in Orange County to east of State Road 434 in Seminole County, adding two new dynamic tolled Express Lanes in each direction, replacing more than 140 bridges, reconfiguring 15 major interchanges and reconstructing the entire roadway.

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
