I-4 Ultimate Closures Forecast: December 17 – 18

Orange County, Fla. – Ahead of the weekend, motorists should anticipate nighttime closures along the Interstate 4 (I-4) corridor for various construction activities.

The nightly closures include Colonial Drive (State Road 50) under I-4 and a full closure of eastbound I-4.

Here are the forecasted major closures from December 17 – 18:
