## **EB I-4 Through Downtown Closing Overnight October 15**

**ORLANDO, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will temporarily close eastbound Interstate 4 (I-4) between South Street and Amelia Street as soon as 11 p.m. October 15 to 5 a.m. October 16.

The eastbound I-4 entrance ramp from Anderson Street, and the eastbound and westbound State Road (S.R.) 408 ramps to I-4 will also close during this time frame, though as early as 10 p.m.

The closures are necessary to install overhead signs.
